

SENIOR TIRE CHANGER

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: This is manual work involving the mounting and dismounting of tires on all types of vehicles in all types of weather. The work is performed in the field and in the garage. In addition, an employee in this class is responsible for maintaining an inventory of tires and ordering tires. Supervision is provided by a higher-level Highways and Bridges employee. An employee in this class provides minimal supervision to lower-level Highways and Bridges employees assigned to this function. Does related work as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: The typical work activities listed below, while providing representative examples of the variety of work assignments in the title, do not describe any individual position. Incumbents in this title may perform some or all of the following, as well as other related activities not described.

Mounts and dismounts tires;

Repairs tires;

Inspects tires;

Maintains an inventory of tires;

Orders tires;

Assists in other automotive repair activities.

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS: Good knowledge of the tools, procedures and safety precautions involved in changing tires; ability to perform physically arduous work; ability to maintain an inventory; ability to provide limited supervision to others; willingness to conduct assignments under poor weather conditions; resourcefulness; good judgment; physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: One year of full-time paid, or it's part-time equivalent, experience in a position in which a major portion of the assignment required the changing and repair of tires.

Special Requirement: Possession of a valid New York State Motor Vehicle Class B Commercial Driver's License (CDL) with required endorsements at time of appointment.

Possession of a Motor Vehicle Inspector's Certificate issued by the New York State Department of Motor Vehicles, if duties include vehicle inspection.

Special Requirement for appointment to Ulster County positions: In accordance with Ulster County Legislative Local Law Number 14 of 2007 or by other State and Federal Statutes, candidates for employment to all Ulster County positions must obtain clearance for appointment from the Department of Criminal Justice Services or other mandated Federal and State regulatory authority based upon fingerprinting and a criminal history background check.

If this is an Ulster County position it will require a criminal background check, and a candidate will be required to complete and sign a Criminal Background Investigation Release Form.

Upon a conditional employment offer a candidate will be required to be fingerprinted accordingly.
