**TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES**: The typical work activities listed below, while providing representative examples of the variety of work assignments in the title, do not describe any individual position. Incumbents in this title may perform some or all of the following, as well as other related activities not described.

Rebuilds motors;

Trouble shoots and repairs automotive brake systems, differentials, transmissions, and front and rear axles;

Trouble shoots and repairs automotive front ends;

Trouble shoots and repairs automotive ignition and electrical systems;

Trouble shoots and repairs automotive exhaust and cooling systems;

Repairs automotive bodies and fenders;

Repairs lights, sirens and public address systems;

Performs a variety of more routine maintenance tasks such as changing tires, belts, spark plugs and oil;

Tunes motors;

Maintains parts inventory and purchases parts to replenish inventory as needed;

Performs repairs to the county motorboat.
