

MACHINIST

GENERAL STATEMENT OF DUTIES: Maintains and operates the equipment of a small machine shop; does related work as required.

DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS: This is skilled work involving the fabrication and machining of parts and tools. The work is performed under the general supervision of the Garage Supervisor with independent judgment exercised in the choice of work methods and materials to use.

EXAMPLES OF WORK: (Illustrative only)

Operates engine lathe, milling machine, drill press, valve refacers, seat grinders, and metal cutting band saw in the fabrication of parts and tools;

Sharpens axes, scythes, pruners, chisels and chipper blades using grinding stone;

Operates saw sharpening machine;

Fabricates new chainsaw blades;

Operates precision measuring equipment such as micrometers and calipers;

Cleans, greases and oils shop equipment and cleans and sweeps the shop;

Maintains stock of drills, bits and other tools needed;

Orders parts and materials needed for shop operation;

Gives technical advice to other personnel when they operate the equipment themselves.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS AND ABILITIES: Good knowledge of the tools and procedures used in machining parts and tools; good knowledge of the safety procedures used in the operation of machining equipment; ability to follow instructions both written and oral; ability to read and follow rough sketches; ability to make routine calculations; manual dexterity; dependability; accuracy; good physical condition.

ACCEPTABLE TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE: Either:

- A. Two (2) years of full-time work experience as a skilled Machinist; **OR**
- B. Satisfactory completion of a course in the operation of machining equipment and one year of experience as a skilled Machinist.
