MUNICIPAL WORKER I

<u>DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS</u>: The work involves responsibility for the performance of various routine Public Works activities. The work is carried out in accordance with established procedures and may involve, but is not limited to maintenance, construction and related work on streets, highways, water and sewer systems (including treatment plants), landfills, buildings, grounds, and parks. The work may involve snow removal. The class differs from that of Municipal Worker II in that Municipal Worker I is the entry level position in the Municipal Worker Series, whereas Municipal Worker II is at the second level and performs both semi-skilled and routine construction and maintenance work. Depending on assignment, work is performed under the general or direct supervision of a higher level employee. Supervision is not normally a function of the class. Does related work as required.

<u>TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES</u>: The typical work activities listed below, while providing representative examples of the variety of work assignments in the title do not describe any individual position. Incumbents in this title may perform some or all of the following, as well as other related activities not described.

Performs routine aspects of trades work, such as painting, automotive mechanics, plumbing, electrical, masonry, etc. requiring little or no training;

Excavates and backfills for construction and repairs;

Operates air compressors, jack hammers, concrete mixers and pumps;

Loads and unloads trucks;

Rakes, dumps and shovels various materials;

Shovels and removes snow and ice:

Cuts grass and performs other grounds maintenance activities;

Performs cleaning activities:

Cuts and removes trees, bushes and brush;

Participates in snow plowing activities;

May operate a motor vehicle.

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS: Working knowledge of a variety of routine Public Works related construction and maintenance procedures; ability to carry out oral instructions; ability to learn and follow safety procedures; willingness to respond to emergencies and work under adverse weather conditions; physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: None.

<u>Special Requirements</u>: Incumbents who operate motor equipment must possess an appropriate level New York State Driver's License.
