YOUTH PROJECT SUPERVISOR

<u>DISTINGUISHING FEATURES OF THE CLASS</u>: An employee in this class plans and supervises the work of Youth Workers and Youth Crew Leaders in the performance of manual work related to environmental conservation. General direction is received from the Director of the Youth Bureau with considerable leeway allocated for the exercise of independent judgment in work details. Does related work as required.

TYPICAL WORK ACTIVITIES: The typical work activities listed below, while providing representative examples of the variety of work assignments in the title do not describe any individual position. Incumbents in this title may perform some or all of the following, as well as other related activities not described.

Plans daily work assignments for the youth crew including such tasks as trail blazing;

Explains and demonstrates work methods and safe use of hand tools;

Provides instruction in environmental conservation techniques and concepts of ecology;

Keeps activity records.

FULL PERFORMANCE KNOWLEDGES, SKILLS, ABILITIES AND PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS: Working knowledge of environmental conservation techniques and ecology; ability to plan and supervise the work of a small crew (approximately nine (9) members); ability to explain and demonstrate conservation work methods and the safe use of hand tools; ability to instruct crew members in environmental conservation techniques and the concept of ecology; physical condition commensurate with the demands of the position.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS: Either:

- A. Sixty (60) semester credit hours in a regionally accredited or New York State registered college or university including at least twelve (12) semester credit hours in environmental science, ecology or related field; **OR**
- B. Two (2) seasons of experience supervising youth activities; **OR**
- C. An equivalent combination of training and experience as described in A and B above.
